


### BUTTERFIELD ANIMAL SCULPTURE




the cardboard. Glue them to the body. Build up more bulk with Paper and masking tape.




Draw the outline of an animal.

Small strips. Dip them into a paper mache mixture.





Supplies: small square canvas, 4 acrylic paint colors, small paint brushes, and a pencil



- 1. Cut a paper-size piece of tinfoil. Use the large brush and paint a thin, even layer of green over the surface of the foil.
- 2. WORK QUICKLY! Use the back of a paint brush to scrape a leafy design into the surface of the green paint. Draw fast. The paint needs to stay wet.
- 3. Lay your Bristol paper over the foil and press hard and evenly. Use the back of a spoon and apply circular pressure over the surface. Peel away the foil.
- 4. While the green layer dries, carefully cut out simple flower forms from the cardstock paper. Set aside the flower. The outside paper is the stencil. Tape any breaks in the stencil.
- 5. Hold the stencil flat on the Bristol paper and use the foam brush to carefully fill in the flower. Allow time to dry in between layers of flowers.
